#### **GUIDANCE FOR BOAT CAPTAINS**

## Responsibilities

The captain's primary responsibility is the safety of the crew

Boat Captains are required to:

- · ensure that their boat is in a safe condition at all times
- determine the crew order
- manage crew welfare during rowing by ensuring provision of water, suitable rest periods and checking for injuries
- ensure whoever is coxing navigates the boat in accordance with the agreed instructions and with due regard to hazards and conditions
- communicate with the designated Tour Coordinator in the event of emergencies afloat
- attend briefings daily or as circumstances dictate to receive guidance from the Tour Coordinator on the itinerary, route, hazards and other safety matters.

## Before going afloat

#### Ensure that:

- You have read the British Rowing Safety Guidance <a href="http://www.britishrowing.org/sites/default/files/rowsafe/3-4-TouringRowing-v1.pdf">http://www.britishrowing.org/sites/default/files/rowsafe/3-4-TouringRowing-v1.pdf</a>
- Your boat is sound with no damage or loose fittings, water tight compartments closed, sound oars / paddles, rudder and mooring line
- You have safety equipment including bailers and buoyancy aid(s) for cox as a minimum.
- You have at least one fully charged mobile phone with waterproof container with number(s) registered with tour management
- Your crew have no injuries or illnesses and are capable of rowing the stated distances
- You attend the pre-row briefings and have the navigation maps for the day

#### **Extreme conditions**

The rowing schedule may be altered or suspended if weather and / or water conditions are very bad e.g. thunderstorms, strong wind causing rough water on the lake.

#### **Emergency Procedures**

In the event of a problem requiring assistance afloat:

- 1. Signal to nearby boats by waving both arms above your head
- 2. Advise local Tour Coordinator (Joerg Hahne) on +49 171 3035326
- 3. If medical emergency or other emergency afloat, call 112 (Deutsche Lebens-Rettungs Dienst)

Always check that you have all items of equipment available before boating and stowed at the end of each day
